The Hot Springs Board of County Commissioners met in Special session on Monday, July 15, 2024, at 1:00 p.m. in the Public Meeting Room at the Government Annex. Present were Commissioners Tom Ryan, Phillip Scheel, and Paul Galovich. Also present were County Attorney Jill Logan, County Clerk Becky Kersten, and Administrative Assistant to the Commissioners Connie Guntly. Chairman Ryan led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>Approval of Agenda</u> – The Commissioners adopted the Agenda with the following changes:

Add: Regular Business #7 – Sheriff, Discussion of Patrol Vehicle

Regular Business#8–Fire Warden, Discussion of Stage 1 Fire Restrictions

Remove: Approval of Revenue and Expenditure Report

<u>Approval of Minutes</u> – The Commissioners approved the minutes from June 28, 2024, and July 2, 2024 meetings.

Approval of Final Budget for Fiscal Year 2024-25 – The Public Hearing for the approval of the Fiscal Year 2024-25 Final Budget was opened at 1:05 pm and Chairman Ryan asked for public comment. Chairman Ryan added Treasurer Mortimore informed Clerk Kersten that after rechecking \$77,108.28 was discovered for the total cash available. The original published budget will go up by that amount in the cash available category with \$108.28 going to emergency expenditure and \$77,000 going to cash reserve. After three calls for public comment and hearing none, Chairman Ryan closed the Public Hearing at 1:09 p.m. The Commissioners approved the Fiscal Year 2024-25 Final Budget, and Resolution 2024-13, Resolution Adopting the Final Budget for Fiscal Year 2024-2025 for Hot Springs County, Wyoming, with the appropriate changes as discussed.

Special Accounts Payable Warrant Register – Special Accounts Payable (AP) Warrant Register for bills totaling \$89,021.96 was submitted for approval (see end for listing). The Commissioners approved all Commissioners sign the Special Accounts Payable for bills totaling \$89,021.96. Discussion: Chairman Ryan stated the main reason for the special AP warrant was for the payment to Mountain West Farm Bureau Insurance.

Review of Black Mountain Road Bid and Selection of Contractor - Dustin Spomer from Ardurra Engineering went over the bids received for the Black Mountain Road Project, with a letter of recommendation to award the bid to Wilson Brothers Construction. Mr. Spomer stated the bid prices were competitive and the overall bid was about 13% more than what was estimated which has been the norm this year. The Commissioners approved to preliminarily award the bid to Wilson Brothers Construction bid packet A, for the Black Mountain Road project. Discussion: Chairman Ryan stated Ardurra is working with Wilson Brothers to negotiate costs. Once awarded the State will review the costs and the overage is the County responsibility. Commissioner Galovich inquired about timeline, Chairman Ryan stated the project could be completed as late as 2026

<u>Discussion of Common Ground Build-</u> ing and Office Space - Shurie Scheel, representative for the Thermopolis Economic Development Company, DBA Thrive Thermopolis, updated the Commissioners on the recent activities. Mrs. Scheel stated a new board was appointed which includes, herself, Phillip Scheel, Kim Bartlett, Wade Lippincott and Shelly Burrows. The Board also contracted with the Chamber of Commerce for admin services, and the Bylaws are being updated. Some Board representatives are participating in the Assessment to Action program through the Wyoming Business Council, Commissioner Galovich is also participating in the project, which is working on a community wide master plan. The office supplies and files previously located at Town Hall need to be moved, Mrs. Scheel is looking for a space to store some of the supplies and is requesting an office at the Common Ground building. Commissioner Scheel stated there is office space down stairs. County Attorney Logan stated

she will draft an agreement for the use of space, the County will not charge for use. The Commissioners approved Thrive Thermopolis to occupy space at the lower level of Common Ground Building.

Authorization to Release the Request for Qualifications for Airport Engineering Services — Chairman Ryan stated every five years the FAA requires the County to go out for a Request for Qualifications for engineering services at the airport. The Commissioners authorized the release of the Request for Qualifications for airport engineering services.

Youth Alternatives Monthly Update

- Barb Rice was otherwise occupied and not able to attend the meeting. An update will be provided at the August 6th meeting.

Discussion of Patrol Vehicle - Sheriff Kraushaar reported to the Commissioners a Deputy driving the 2019 Ram truck hit an elk. The truck had 58,000 miles on it and was well maintained. The Sheriff believes the truck will probably be totaled, however the insurance company had not come out to assess it yet. Sheriff Kraushaar stated he traded the 2015 Ram truck in for the new patrol truck from Fremont Motors, and contacted Fremont Motors asking to keep the 2015 Ram truck (in light of this accident) and will pay the difference back to Fremont Motors for the trade in value, the funds will be taken out of the Sheriff budget in hopes the insurance will pay the funds back to the budget. Sheriff Kraushaar is asking if that is acceptable to do. Commissioner Galovich asked will there be any consequences with Fremont Motors, Sheriff Kraushaar stated there will not be, the contract will be rewritten. All the Commissioners agree this will be fine to do.

Discussion of Stage 1 Fire Restrictions - Fire Warden Dion Robbins, stated BLM is going to fire restrictions starting the week of July 15th. Mr. Robbins stated it is easier if all counties/entities enter into fire restrictions at the same time so a region has the same rules to avoid confusion, and the fire forecast is not looking good in the coming weeks. Chairman Ryan suggested the fire restrictions can start Monday July 22nd the Resolution can be approved today and signature stamps can be affixed once ready. The Commissioners approved all Commissioners sign a Resolution for Level 1 Fire Restrictions starting July 22nd 2024, as it has been done in the past.

Other Business – 1) Request for Approv-<u>al of Memorandum of Understanding with</u> Wyoming Office of Guardian Ad Litem, in the Amount of 25% of Fees Paid to County and Admin Fees, Effective Upon Full Execution Through June 30, 2025 - The Commissioners approved Chairman's signature on the agreement with Hot Springs County and the Office of Guardian Ad Litem. County Clerk Kersten stated the agreement came with Commissioner Scheel as the signer, Clerk Kersten reached out to the state requesting a new signature page and had not heard back from them by the time of the meeting. Chairman Ryan authorized the use of his stamp when the new signature page comes in. 2) Discussion and Possible Action of National Opioid Settlement Participation Documents - Administrative Assistant to the Commissioners Connie Guntly went over the opt in documents for the third round of Opioid Settlement funds. Mrs. Guntly stated there are currently 4 entities that have requested funding for the abatement strategies, but no requests for reimbursement have been submitted. Chairman Ryan suggested opting in to be eligible for the funding when it comes in. Commissioner Scheel inquired whether the County is locked into the funding if opted in, County Attorney Logan stated the County is not obligated if it decides to not utilize the funds, the money would be returned to the settlement for re-disbursement. The Commissioners approved to opt in to the National Opioid Settlement. 3) Request for Approval of Federal Financial Annual Report, FS 425, for Federal Fiscal Year 22-23 Airport ARPA <u>Grant</u> – County Clerk Kersten stated the report is from the \$22,000 ARPA grant for operation services at the airport, this was a 4-year grant, the County has not utilized the grant, however there is one more year left. The annual report is required every year, even if funds were not utilized. The Commissioners approved Chairman's signature on the Federal Financial Report that

The Hot Springs Board of County Commissioners met in Special session on Thursday, July 18, 2024, at 8:00 a.m. in the District Court Juror Room at the County Court House. Present were Commissioners Tom Ryan, Phillip Scheel, and Paul Galovich. Also present were County Attorney Jill Logan, County Clerk Becky Kersten, County Project Manager Les Culliton, and via phone, Dusty Spomer with Ardurra. As there was no American Flag in the room, the Pledge of Allegiance was dispensed.

Approval of Agenda - The Commissioners adopted the Agenda as presented.

Rejection and Approval to Re-Bid the Black Mountain Road Project - Commissioner Ryan explained the purpose of the special meeting was the Commissioner's rejection of the Wilson Construction bid for the Black Mountain Road upon recommendation by WYDOT.

Mr. Spomer explained WYDOT did not want after-the-fact changes after the bid was accepted. Therefore it is recommended the County re-bid the project. Mr. Spomer explained a letter was sent to project bidders indicating there would be changes and a rebid. A couple of items that will be eliminated include sign posts (the County will provide the signs and posts), and a large box culvert that needed remediation/maintenance. Mr. Spomer felt the box culvert work was highly elective with too high of a bid price so it will be removed. Also the bid will redefine or further define work on cattle guards to make it clearer this is very limited work on existing, not new cattle guards. Mr. Spomer said the intention is to re-bid with the same package and alternatives, with the exception of the items discussed above. The hope is the bid will: 1) rely on the ability to adjust quantities during the project, and 2) an expectation to see some line items come in considerably lower. Mr. Spomer explained it appears the bids did not include a close examination of overhead items, such as traffic control and contractor provided testing. Mr. Spomer indicated they will ask the contractors to take a closer look, with the hopes the bids will come in lower.

Commissioner Ryan wanted to clarify that removal of any of these items from the bid would not affect federal funding. Mr. Spomer stated nothing adjusted will go against the County Road Manual, against any industry standard, or anything dictated by the Environmental Categorical Exclusion that covers the project.

Commissioner Galovich inquired about the new timeline. Mr. Spomer stated the bid would be sent to the Independent Record July 19th and would run July 25th and August 1st.

Commissioners set the re-bid opening for August 8th, with the bid results presented to the Commissioners at a special meeting to be set at the regular Commissioners meeting on August 6, 2024, with intent to get the re-bid results to the WYDOT Commission by August 13th.

The Commissioners rejected the original bids received and subsequently preliminarily awarded at the July 15th meeting.

The Commissioners authorized Ardurra to go back out to bid for the Black Mountain Road project with adjustments outlined by Mr. Spomer; bids to be opened August 8th, 2024 and the Commissioner to hold a special meeting to approve the new bid and have the results to WYDOT by August 13.
